IMPORTANT NOTE: Any hours earned at Miami Nice will apply to the biennium which starts 3/1/17 and ends 2/28/19 Current Florida CE requirements for each biennium are: 6 hours Florida TQ, 2 hours medical errors, 2 hours Florida jurisprudence, 20 additional hours in general topics (only two of which may be practice management), for a total of 30 hours. You can only get credit for Florida jurisprudence or medical errors once in each biennium. (That means, if you take either one twice, you do not get any credit for the second course.) One hour of HIV/AIDS is no longer required, except for new graduates or new licensees who have not yet taken an HIV/AIDS course. However, any doctor can take HIV/AIDS and count that as one hour of general CE, and you can take HIV/AIDS more than once, provided it is a different lecture (generally, a different speaker).

Due to requirements in other states for approving continuing education, the Miami Dade Optometric Physicians Association will not be responsible for obtaining approval for these courses in advance. However, 10 hours will be COPE approved and perhaps more. It is the responsibility of doctors licensed in other states to determine if these courses meet the requirements of their state. Of course, all courses will be approved in Florida.
